



Survey by Episcopal Region of the Grades Confirmation is Celebrated

PLEASE READ THIS OVERVIEW BEFORE READING REGIONAL AND NATIONAL SUMMARIES.

These are the preliminary reports on the average age of confirmation in Roman Catholic dioceses nationally. This report was the result of a voluntary survey sent to diocesan Directors of Religious Education and Directors of Youth Ministry. Primarily only one person from each diocese responded, however occasionally both directors responded. The reports are divided by episcopal region and include a national report.

To better understand the results, this is how each question was interpreted.

Question 1:

Please select the title that best describes your position:

- Director of Faith Formation excluding HS adolescent catechesis*
- Director of Faith Formation including HS adolescent catechesis*
- Director of Youth (and Young Adult) Ministry excluding HS adolescent catechesis*
- Director of Youth (and Young Adult) Ministry including HS adolescent catechesis*
- Other, please describe*

Percentages are exactly as individuals self-identified and include all respondents' answers.

Question 2:

On average, at what grade(s) do most parishes celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in your diocese?

Please select the grade(s) that apply to the majority of your parishes. Choices available:

If a diocese had more than one respondent the answers of the two individuals were combined into a single answer. For example, if the DRE of diocese Y responded "10th and 11th grades" and the DYM of diocese Y responded, "9th, 10th, and 11th grades," the answer logged for diocese Y would be "9th, 10th, and 11th grades."

The results are divided into three categories:

- Average grade of confirmation
- Grade at which the most dioceses confirm – the grade that had the highest number of responses
- Grade ranges in which diocese confirm - 2nd-3rd, 6th-8th only, 9th-12th only, 6th-12th grade, and Open/Readiness/Other

Questions 3 and 4:

What diocesan office is primarily responsible for supporting parish Confirmation preparation programs?

What diocesan office is primarily responsible for supporting adolescent catechesis in parishes?

These were “open response” questions. Respondent could enter their own descriptions of the offices. This however made interpretation difficult. Some diocesan offices of Religious Education, Faith Formation, and Evangelization include departments of sacramental preparation, youth and young adult ministry, and catechesis. For the purposes of classification, diocesan offices that identified themselves as “Faith Formation,” “Religious Education,” “Catechesis,” “Evangelization,” “Family Catechesis,” or included multiple age groups were listed as “Office of Religious Education/Catechesis/Faith Formation.” Please note that these offices could include an individual or department that is involved in youth ministry.

If more than one person responded from a diocese and their answers differed from each other, the diocesan response was listed as “Both.”

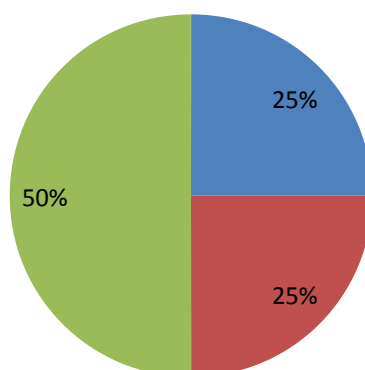

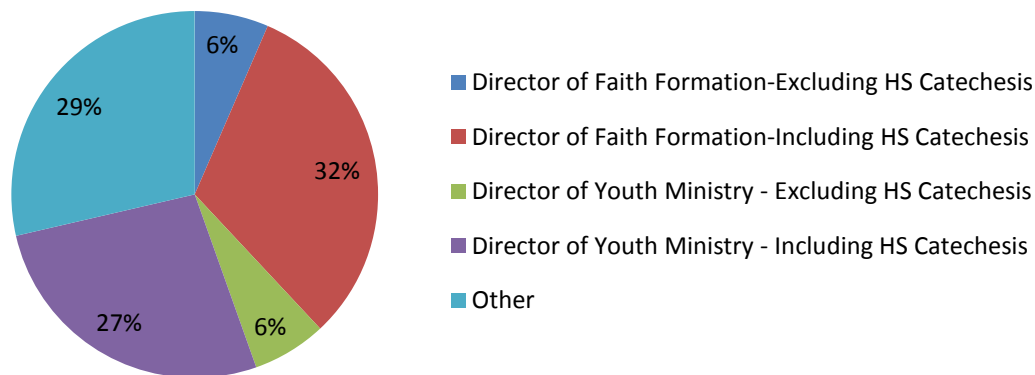

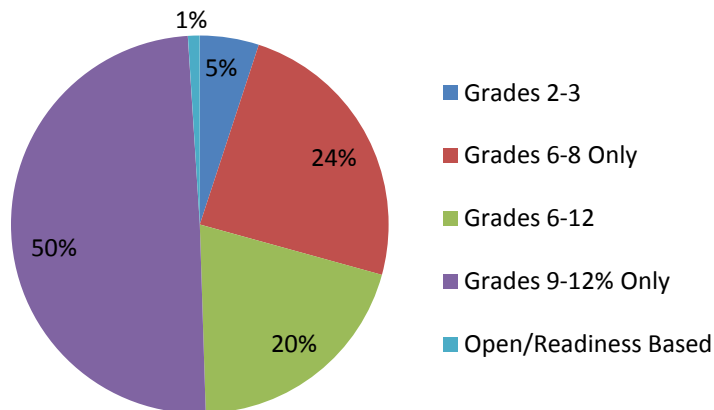
